Sir

I have received your favors of the
13th and 14th Instant.

You are hereby authorized to have the objects
therein recommended effected, viz:

✓ A dwelling house built of stone for the use of
the Keeper of Thatcher's Island Light House, provided the
expense shall not exceed twelve hundred dollars

✓ The Light House and Dwelling house at Wigwam
Point painted, and a porch and road made to the
house, provided the expense shall not exceed two hun-
dred and fifty dollars.

✓ The Keeper of Plum Island Light House furnished
with a boat, provided the expense shall not exceed
twenty five dollars.

✓ The Light House and dwelling house at Boon
Island whitewashed, provided the expense shall not
exceed twenty dollars.

✓ A new dwelling house built of stone for the use
of the Keeper of Portland Light House, provided the

expense shall not exceed twelve hundred dollars.

✓ The Franklin Island Light House painted, provided the expense shall not exceed eighty dollars.

✓ The Light House at Passamaquoddy painted, and a floor made, provided the expense shall not exceed one hundred and fifty dollars.

The wharf at Boston Light House repaired, provided the expense shall not exceed one hundred dollars.
