

Bird Island, November 3. 1819.

Sir

In obedience to your directions contained ⁱⁿ the Circular Letter, marked No. 1 dated at the "Collector's Office, Boston, August 30th. 1819," I herewith transmit my Account for the Quarter ending on the 30th Nov. current.

When I arrived at Sippigon, I was under the necessity of hiring a Boat, as no boat was at that time furnished. Should you think the charge a proper one, you will be pleased to consider it, otherwise Sir, you can throw it aside. I regret the necessity which impels me to the observation, that it would be matter of great accommodation to receive the amount of my Account by the time it becomes due. Owing to a disappointment in my endeavours to collect some money previous to coming to this place, I have been unable to provide for the severity of Winter; during most part of which I shall probably be confined to the Island.
