

ADDITIONAL SUM FOR PROJECTS OF LIGHTHOUSE DEPT.

**ROBERTS AND PEAT, CON-
TRACTORS, TO GET \$1,200
FOR OTHER WORK TO BE
CARRIED ON**

Roberts and Peat, contractors, who are now fulfilling a \$15,000 contract for extensive repairs at the lighthouse depot, have been awarded an additional sum of more than \$1,200 for other work.

In the immense industrial building, the concrete floor of which is being placed at this time, a series of concrete and fabricated wire partitions are to be placed.

In these divisions will be placed the lamp shop, the blacksmith shop, machine shop and boat building department. These activities are now housed in the eastern end of the storeroom.

There are a number of changes under way at this time, including the construction of a concrete wall and posts with iron fence panels. This wall fence will separate the lighthouse department from the navy department holdings.

The coal hoists, which have been there for many years, are slowly being removed. This work requires the continued use of oxy-acetylene torches as all bolts and pins have rusted and corroded to such an extent that the only manner in which the hoists can be dismantled is to cut them away.

Officers of the navy who formerly occupied Number 1 building and had the adjoining property under their supervision would fail to recognize it so thorough has the transformation been and so complete the changes effected.
