

1860. "A sloop first used in Minots Ledge light-house construction. In Nov. 1860 she was altered at a cost of about \$900, and used as a tender in the 4th District. *2d Dist*

1865. At the breaking out of the rebellion she was loaned to the War Dept., and returned to the L.H. Board in June 1865.

She was repaired at the Washington Navy-yard, and early in 1866 was again sent to the 4th District. *4th Dist.*

1866. She was sold at Philadelphia, in Dec. 1866, for \$2,092.99."

1866. This amount was deposited in the Treasury to the credit of the appropriation "For expenses raising, &c. Buoys, &c.", Dec. 12, 1866. See L.R. Vol. 191, p. 145.

On June 23, 1865, the Granite, Coeur de Léon, Cactus, Putnam,

J.W.Seymour (Tulip), and Heliotrope, were turned over to the Light-house Establishment at Washington navy-yard, by the War Dept.

The Granite and Cour de Léon were sent to the 4th District, but found to be worthless, and sold.
