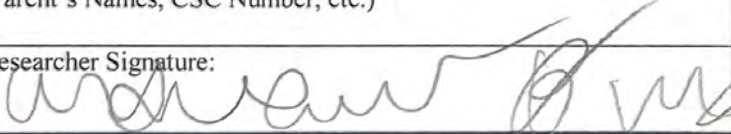

Returned to the EIGHTH Inspector, with statement that the Department letter in question requires that the Inspectors state whether the person selected for appointment stands first, second, or third of those available for appointment. This was not done in the present case, the Inspector stating that the nominee stood No. five. As the four eligibles preceding Alidon E. Guidry either declined or failed to reply they should have been considered as not being available for appointment, and therefore Alidon E. Guidry should have been stated as standing No. one of those being available for appointment. Under the Civil Service rules, eligibles are considered in groups of three, and, therefore, statement should be made as to whether or not the person nominated stood first, second, or third in the group available for appointment.

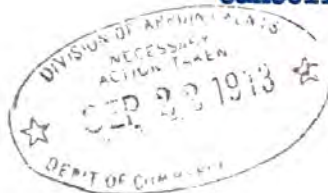

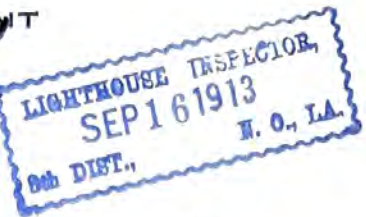

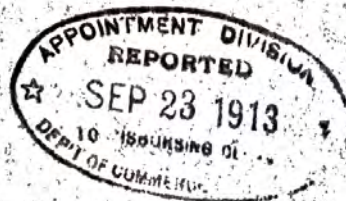

In case the officer administering the oath has no seal, his official character should be duly certified to by the clerk of the proper court or the proper county clerk, except in the case of chief clerks in the offices of lighthouse inspectors and other employees in the Lighthouse Service designated by them, who are not required to have a seal.⁵ Give this information in all cases where new oath is required.

Referring to your letter of August 3, 1918, stating that Additional Assistant Keeper John R. Dominick would not return to the station with you, having accepted employment elsewhere:

You are authorized to employ another person to act as additional assistant keeper at Ship Shoal Light Station until a regular keeper can be appointed. The person employed must be a citizen of the United States and at least 18 years old. Salary will be paid him at the rate of \$456 per annum and the usual ration allowance. Furnish the following information relative to the person selected:

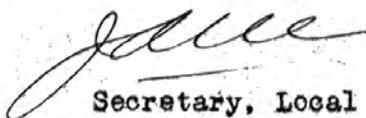

When answering the second part of Question 10 state exactly between what ports along the coast or in what States you will accept a position if offered. If your answer to the first part of Question 10 is "Yes," it will not be necessary for you to fill out the second part of that question.

Forward your application promptly to this office, duly filled out, and it will be rated at the first examination by the District Civil Service Board in this city. If you attain the required percentage your name will be entered on the eligible register and given due consideration for appointment in accordance with Civil Service Rules when vacancies occur.
