CAPT. ALFRED G. EISNER.

Lighthouse Keeper Off Coast of New England 35 Years.

HOLLISTON, Mass., May 26.—
Captain Alfred G. Eisner, for thirty-five years keeper of lighthouses off the New England coast and holder of several medals for bravery and efficiency, died today at his home on Washington Street here. He had been in ill health since November. He was 88 years old and had retired.

During his career in the United States lighthouse service he had been in charge of the lighthouses at Thatcher's Island off Cape Ann, the Gurnet lights at Cuttyhunk and Lovell's Island range light station.

Captain Eisner was a native of Bremen, Me., where he attended school until he was 15, when he went to sea. He followed the sea for twenty years, the last ten of which he served as master, pilot or mate of coastwise trading vessels.
